The Egyptians Plot in Vain

- Exodus 1:22

Then Pharaoh commanded all his people, “Every son that is born to the Hebrews you shall cast into the Nile, but you shall let every daughter live.”

The Egyptians Plot in Vain

- What Pharaoh meant for the Israelites destruction, God used for their salvation
 - Exodus 2:1-10
 - “Drawn out of water” (verse 10)

The Egyptians Plot in Vain

- What Pharaoh meant for the Israelites destruction, God used to destroy the Egyptians
 - Exodus 14:21-31
 - The waters returned and covered the chariots and the horsemen; of all the host of Pharaoh that had followed them into the sea, not one of them remained. (v. 28)

Satan Plots in Vain

- Luke 22:2-4

And the chief priests and the scribes were seeking how to put him to death, for they feared the people. Then Satan entered into Judas called Iscariot, who was of the number of the twelve. He went away and conferred with the chief priests and officers how he might betray him to them.

 - Hebrews 9:22-26
 - “But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.”

 - Romans 16:20
