1 Kings 17:1-16

God always finds men and women to meet the challenge of the situation:

- Noah begin the human race anew.
- Abraham begin to build a great nation through which the Messiah would come.
- > Joseph keep Israel separate and safe.
- Moses lead Israel out of slavery, into Canaan.
- > Judges deliver Israel from surrounding nations.
- David secure Israel from enemies, make it the dominant power in the Middle East.
- > Esther save Israel from annihilation.

Elijah – God's great prophet during the reign of wicked Ahab and Jezebel.

A person of uncommon fiber.

Great courage and conviction.

God needs such men and women today!

Elijah's first message: "No rain for three years!"

A physical manifestation of the nation's spiritual condition.

Elijah taken care of by God: Water from Cherith, food from ravens.

God's second plan: Send Elijah to a destitute widow in Zarephath.

God is concerned about widows too!

God is champion of society's most vulnerable.

- Deut. 24:17-22 A principle in Law of Moses.
- ► Isa. 1:17 "Defend the fatherless, plead for the widow."
- ► James 1:27 Every Christian's charge: "Visit orphans and widows in their distress."

God is concerned about widows too!

God knows the condition of everyone – no one escapes His caring eye.

- > Psa. 139:7-10 Cannot get so low that God does not see and care.
- ➤ <u>Mat. 10:29-31</u> God knows the most minute details about you every hair on your head. Every sigh, every tear.

Elijah's promise:

Give me your little now, and I will guarantee infinitely more later.

The deal God has always offered:

- > Adam and Eve.
- > Israel through Moses.
- > The whole world through the gospel of Christ.

Luke 18:28-30 – More now, infinitely more later.

Phil. 3:7-11 – The temporal rubbish Paul gave up for the eternal salvation of his soul.

Elijah's promise:

Give me your little now, and I will guarantee infinitely more later.

It was really the Lord's promise.

- > Required trust (faith).
- ➤ <u>Heb. 11:1</u> What gives substance to a promise, what makes a promise all the assurance we need.
- ► Heb. 11:6 An absolute necessity if we are going to please God by giving up our little now for great riches later.

Elijah's promise:

Give me your little now, and I will guarantee infinitely more later.

- 1 Kings 17:12 "That we may eat and die."
- ➤ <u>Mat. 26:14-16</u> Judas: 30 pieces of silver that he could never keep.
- 2 Tim 4:10 Demas: A temporal relationship that he could never keep.
- Rev. 3:17-18 Laodicea: Fake things that could never make them truly rich or healthy.

The widow's lesson for us:

Choose the never-ending riches of the hereafter over the paltry things of the here and now.
