Legalist or Liberal?

Defining Terms:

Legalist - a term we use when someone is trying to impose something we don't agree with.

Liberal - a term we use when someone disagrees with what we're trying to impose on them.

Defining Terms:

Legalism - advocates for a strict adherence to a particular set of rules or laws. (Josh. 1.7-8) Ritualism - advocates for a strict adherence to the letter of the law without consideration of intent. (Mt. 15.8) Merit-ism - advocates for a strict adherence to a set of Laws as a means of earning favor. (Ro. 9.30-10.4) Liberalism - advocates for the loosening of a particular set of laws. (Deut. 4.1-6)

Some "Legalistic" Things Jesus Taught: "I have...come... to fulfill them" Mt. 5.17-18 "Unless your righteousness exceeds ..." Mt. 5.20 "The one who does the will of my Father ..." Mt. 7.21 "Neglected the weightier matters of the Law" Mt. 23.23 "If you love me you will keep my command..." Jn. 14.15 Jesus was a legalist when it came to God's Law.

Some "Liberal" Things Jesus Taught: "to eat with unwashed hands does not defile..."Mt. 15.20 "The Sabbath was made for man" Mk. 2.27 "Can the wedding guests mourn as long as..." Mt. 9.15

Jesus was a liberal when it came to man's traditions.

What's the Point?

Jesus had a standard that He followed and that standard was nothing more or less than the Word of God!

What About Grace?

Law keeping (legalism) is not contrary to grace:

- Our efforts to keep the Law demonstrate our need for grace. (Gal. 3.19)
- Obedience to God's Law is the proper response to God's grace. (Eph. 2.8-10)
- Grace empowers us to better keep God's Law. (Titus 2.11-14)
