

The Backdrop of the Exodus Narrative

"Israel groaned"-Ex. 2.23-35; 6.2-8

How They Got Here:

- > Joseph rises to power in Egypt. Ge. 41.37-45
- > Joseph's family joins him in Egypt. Ge. 46-50
- > The Israelites multiplied in the land. Ex.1.1-7
- > There arose a new king in Egypt. Ex. 1.8-10
- > The Israelites became slaves. Ex. 1.11-22

The Structure of the Exodus Narrative

God promises to redeem His firstborn. Ex. 4.21-23 Moses' firstborn must be circumcised. Ex. 4.24-26 Pharaoh refuses God's firstborn. Ex. 5.1-10.29 God redeems His firstborn. Ex. 11.1-12.29 Pharaoh releases God's firstborn. Ex. 12.30-42 Only the circumcised can partake. Ex. 12.43-51 The people must redeem their firstborn. Ex. 13.1-16

The Climax of the Exodus Narrative

"Yet one plague more I will bring..." Ex. 11.1

The Passover:

- ➢ God would kill the firstborn in Egypt. Ex. 11.5
- God would spare those with the blood. Ex. 12.13
- > The firstborn of Egypt were killed. Ex.12.29
- > Pharaoh released God's firstborn. Ex. 12.31

The NT Fulfillment of the Exodus Narrative

- "Israel is my firstborn son" Ex. 4.22
 "you... the assembly of the firstborn" He. 12.22
- "They... made them work as slaves" Ex. 1.14
 "For when you were slaves of sin" Ro. 6.20
- "When I see the blood, I will pass over" Ex 12.13
 "with the precious blood of Christ" 1 Pe. 1.19
- "Consecrate to me all the firstborn" Ex. 13.1 "might no longer live for themselves" 2 Co. 5.15
