Option #1

Organize a para-church organization to
which churches can contribute money to do
a greater work than any single church can do
individually.

The old "bait and switch!"

#1 Thing Wrong With That:
It very rarely works in the long run.

What you use to get them, you'll have to continue using to keep them.

John 6:24-27 – They stayed for the loaves and fishes!

Pragmatism – Justifying the doing of something just because it seems to work.
